Karen Shepard, Williams class of 1987, lecturer in English at Williams, and now novelist, will be making her first book tour stop at the Club this November. In *An Empire of Women*, her first novel, Ms. Shepard returns three generations of Asian women to a family cabin in Virginia. With a penetrating wit and an eye for telling detail, Ms. Shepard captures the reunion of an autocratic French-Chinese photographer, Celine, with her emotionally and culturally displaced Asian-American daughter, Sumin, and granddaughter, Cam. It is an unusual story weaving betrayal, disrespect and familial tension against a backdrop of serene tranquility and a mysterious past.

An Empire of Women introduces Shepard's unique poetic voice to the world. She has been greeted with rave reviews in *The Washington Post*, *Bomb*, and *The New York Times*. In their recent September issue, *Vogue* magazine published an author profile of Ms. Shepard along with a review of her book. Ms. Shepard will be available to autograph copies of her book. Evan Galbraith has had a slightly atypical course of career twists and turns. After graduating from Yale in 1950 and Harvard Law School in 1953, Mr. Galbraith joined the U.S. Navy, where he served until 1957. After three years at the law firm of Shearman and Sterling, he served as the Special Assistant to the Secretary of Commerce. At the Morgan Guaranty Trust Co. from 1961-69, Galbraith served as assistant vice president, administrator and director of Morgan and Cie, Paris, France and then Vice President of Morgan Guaranty Trust Company. From 1969-1975, Mr. Galbraith served as managing director and chairman of Bankers Trust International in London, England. He was Chairman of Dillon Read Overseas Co. in London from 1975-1980. From 1980-1984, Mr. Galbraith served as the United States Ambassador to France, after which he wrote the book *Ambassador in Paris: The Reagan Years*. Upon leaving government service, Mr. Galbraith joined Morgan Stanley, heading the Paris office. He is now an Advisory Director at Morgan Stanley and the Chairman of National Review.

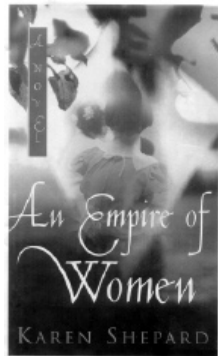
