

NASSAU COUNTRY CLUB

The Princeton Club of New York (PCNY) members will be permitted to utilize Nassau Country Club's (NCC) golf, tennis, swimming, squash, platform tennis and dining facilities.

All charges must be made to a PCNY Member account. There is no other method of payment acceptable for use of facilities and consumption whilst on premises.

Golf

Each PCNY member will be granted playing privileges on NCC's golf course a maximum of twelve (12) rounds per season with a maximum of twice per month. The fee for golf will be:

<i>Greens Fee:</i>	\$125 per golfer
<i>Cart Fee:</i>	\$36 per golfer plus tax
<i>Caddy Fee:</i>	\$80.00 per golfer paid directly to the caddy in cash (gratuity optional)
<i>Putter Service:</i>	\$35.00 per golfer paid directly to the caddy in cash (gratuity optional)

Caddies are mandatory (subject to availability)

PCNY members may bring up to 3 guests per day. PCNY golf foursomes will be accommodated based on availability. Please call the Golf Shop at NCC on (516) 676 0554 and identify yourself a PCNY member to ensure availability prior to arrival.

There are no tee times at Nassau Country Club. PCNY members must register at the Golf Shop by name.

No PCNY guest will be permitted to play unless the guest plays with a PCNY member.

Racquets, Swimming, and Dining

Each PCNY member will be granted tennis and swimming privileges a maximum of twelve (12) days per season. The fees will be as follows:

<i>Racquet facilities:</i>	\$35 per day, per person
<i>Swimming facilities:</i>	\$30 per day, per person

PCNY members desiring to use the NCC's dining, Racquets, or swimming facilities will be accommodated based on availability and must call the NCC Office at (516) 676 0554 (identifying themselves as a PCNY member) to ensure availability prior to arrival.

NCC dining facilities will be available to PCNY members for lunch and dinner. Reservations will be required in advance on special occasions and holidays and will be subject to availability.

There is no limit on dining privileges.

RULES & REGULATIONS

CLUB OPERATIONS:

- Operating Hours:
 - The Club is open Tuesday through Sunday. The Club is closed on Monday to all member activity, unless there is a scheduled event. When a holiday falls on a Monday, the Club will be open that day, but will close the following day (Tuesday).
- Smoking:
 - Nassau Country Club maintains a smoke free clubhouse. Due to government regulations, smoking is also not allowed in any areas where there is food and beverage service. Accordingly, there will be no smoking on the Upper or Lower Terraces during times of food and beverage service. We appreciate your compliance.
 - Smoking is never allowed in the Swimming Pool area.
 - Smoking is only permitted on the golf course and any other designated areas.
- Cell Phones:
 - Talking or listening on cell phones is not permitted anywhere in the Clubhouse, the Front Entryway, or on the Club Grounds, with the exception of discreet usage in the Locker Rooms and the Club Parking Lot.
 - Members and guests may text/email in any area of the Club, but we ask everyone to use discretion when doing so.
 - Phones and all other electronic devices should be kept on silent or vibrate at all times.
- Dress Code:
 - Clubhouse and Club Grounds:
 - The following are considered improper attire anywhere on Club grounds (please see the Swimming Pool section for exceptions):
 - Cut-off or running shorts.
 - Cargo pants or cargo shorts.
 - Jeans of any color except:

- Ladies may wear white jeans that are in keeping with the Club atmosphere. Jeans may not be worn on the Golf Course.
 - T-shirts, or sweatshirts.
 - Any article of clothing with inappropriate wording.
- Hats will not be worn in the Clubhouse. Outside, hats will be worn in the forward position.
- Shirts are to be tucked inside trousers/shorts.
- Bare feet are not acceptable anywhere outside the pool area or locker rooms.
- Jackets are the appropriate evening attire for gentlemen in the Dining Room, unless the evening specifies business casual attire or that a tie is also required. Business casual attire is defined as collared shirts and slacks. When ties are required for evenings and/or other events, this will be specified.
- For Friday night dinners, business casual attire in keeping with the Club atmosphere is appropriate. For Wednesday evenings, Casual Dining, and Sunday evenings, jackets are optional, however, appropriate business casual attire is required.
- All children must be neatly and appropriately attired.
- Golf and tennis shorts, or warm-up suits, are out of place in the Great Hall and all upstairs dining rooms. Such attire is acceptable in the Grill Room.
- Clothing not in keeping with the standards for golf or tennis is not appropriate in the clubhouse or elsewhere on Club property.
- Platform Tennis attire is only appropriate on the courts or at the Calamity Jane House immediately before, during, or directly after matches.

- Golf:
 - The following articles of clothing are not appropriate attire for any of the golf facilities at the Club, including the Golf Course, the Practice Tee, the Putting Green and the Practice Area:

- Shirts without collars (men only). During cooler months, October through March, turtleneck shirts or mock collar shirts with a minimum 1.5” collar may be worn for golf.
- Cargo pants or cargo shorts.
- Fishnet or mesh shirts.
- Short shorts or tennis shorts.
 - Bermuda shorts, not to exceed 6” from center of kneecap to bottom of hem, are permitted.
- Cut-off or running shorts.
- Jean-cut style pants, whether denim or other fabric.
- High-top sneakers.
- Attire generally suitable for beachwear, including bathing suits.
- Jogging attire.
- T-shirts, sweatshirts, tank or halter tops.
- Tennis & Platform Tennis:
 - Sneakers other than tennis flat-style are not permitted on the tennis courts.
 - Warm-up type suits are permitted when playing tennis or platform tennis, but are inappropriate for wear at other times and for other sports.
 - Sweat suits and high-top sneakers are not permitted for platform tennis.
 - Children 18 years old and under must be dressed in 90% white attire

(shirts/shorts/skirts) and white (or predominantly white) tennis sneakers. White hats are preferred, however, colored hats are acceptable.

- Gentlemen’s attire must include proper tennis shorts, and in combination may be 50% color.

- No tee shirts, cut-offs or jogging shorts permitted.
 - Ladies top and skirt combinations may be 50% color.
 - Dresses may be a solid pastel color with trim.
- Grounds & Pool:
 - Members and their children are not permitted to arrive at the Club in bathing suits without cover-ups. After changing to bathing suits, members must stay in the pool area.
 - Bathing suits, with or without cover-ups, are not permitted on the Great Lawn or the Clubhouse (other than the Locker Rooms).
 - Children in bathing suits are not permitted to roam the porches, the clubhouse, the tennis courts or other areas. Attire not acceptable on the golf course or tennis courts is not permitted elsewhere on the grounds.
- Locker Rooms:
 - Golf bags or other paraphernalia should not obstruct the aisles or occupy the benches or the tops of lockers. Bags and other items should be stored under benches, or on the racks provided.
 - It is expected that members, their spouses and guests will do their part to keep the locker rooms neat and orderly. Clothes should be picked up by their owners and not be left for the locker room attendants.
 - There are no children under the age of sixteen (16), including babies, permitted in the Men's Locker Room or the Ladies' Downstairs Locker Room.
 - Any clothing and/or diaper changing must be done in either the Boy's Locker Room or the Ladies Upstairs Locker Room.

GOLF:

- Mode and Speed of Play:
 - The normal mode of play is in foursomes.
 - Each player must have a golf bag and set of clubs.
 - Members and guests are expected to give due consideration to groups playing behind them. Groups are expected to keep up with the group in front of them. If a group falls one or more holes behind the group in front of them and they

are holding up the group behind them, they are expected to invite the group behind to play through. Singles, twosomes, and threesomes may be invited through as a courtesy.

- The golf professional staff and the Golf Committee may monitor pace of play and may address slow play as required.
- The Golf Committee and the golf professional staff are charged with the responsibility of reminding players when they are guilty of slow play. Under normal conditions, foursomes are expected to play in four hours or less. The Golf Committee is responsible to notify members who are consistently slow that a failure to respond will require action.
- Players who stop to eat at 10th tee lose their place to succeeding players if the tee is open for play.
- Practice:
 - The Practice Facilities are defined as the Putting Green, the Practice Range and the Short Game Area located to the right of the eighth (8th) hole. Practice must be limited to the Practice Facilities. Practice on greens, bunkers, tees and fairways is prohibited. The consistent playing of more than one ball on the golf course constitutes practicing.
 - No practicing is allowed on days when the Club or the Golf Course is closed.
 - Use of the Putting Green is restricted to putting and chip shots. No pitching to this green is permitted. Pitching may be practiced at the Short Game Area.
 - Use of the Practice Facilities is restricted to members and their families. Guests may only use the Practice Facilities if they have been charged a greens fee for the day.
- Course Care:
 - Each member has a responsibility to assist in the conditioning of the golf course for the benefit of all. This includes repairing ball marks, replacing divots, raking and smoothing out bunkers, picking up litter and anything that will help keep our course in peak condition.
- Golf Carts:
 - Cart rental rates to be established by the Board of Directors.
 - Golf carts may not be reserved in advance by any member at any time except in the following instance:

- During the months where it is feasible to do so, golf carts may be taken out until 7 p.m. All carts must be returned to Caddie House by 8:30 p.m.
- Golf carts must not be driven on the tees, or within 20 yards of a green or bunker. Direction signs near all greens must be followed. Signs will be posted, or notification will be given, when carts are not allowed on fairways.
- No more than two (2) persons may ride in a golf cart at any time.
- Caddies:
 - All PCNY players must use caddies when available.
 - Caddies may not be reserved. All caddies will be assigned through the Caddie Master.
- Golf Practice Range:
 - All players must follow the signs posted on the driving range, specifically regarding the maximum distances allowed to hit golf balls. This is true regardless of time of day, or the amount of play currently on the course, with the only exception being under the direction of the Golf Professional.

RACQUETS:

- Use of the Racquet facilities (Tennis, Squash, Platform Tennis) by PCNY is limited to two (2) times per month to a maximum of twelve annually.

SWIMMING POOL:

- Pool hours are fixed by the Board of Directors. The pool will only be guarded during those hours. Swimming at other hours is not permitted.
- PCNY Members and their children are not permitted to arrive at the Club in bathing suits without cover-ups. After changing to bathing suits, members must stay in the pool area.
- Bathing suits with or without cover-ups are not permitted on the Great Lawn or Clubhouse (other than Locker Rooms).
- Children in swim suits are not permitted to roam porches, the clubhouse, the tennis courts or other areas.

- Attire not acceptable on the golf course or tennis courts is not permitted elsewhere on the grounds.
- All children under 12 years of age must be under direct personal supervision of an adult at the poolside and at the paddle pool.
- Parents of children at the pool must stay on Club property at all times, unless there is a previously registered babysitter or nannie at the Club who is in charge of the child.
- Children must be neat and quick in the locker rooms and must not interfere with adults. A special locker room has been provided for boys under 16 and must be used; under no conditions are boys under 16 permitted to enter or use the Men's Locker Room. Loitering in the children's locker area is prohibited.
- Rough-housing or ball-playing in the pool or pool area is forbidden at all times. Safety of the children and comfort of adult members requires strict observance of this rule.
- Towels are to be signed out at the entrance to the deck area and returned upon departure.
- All food must be kept on tables. Plastic glasses and cups only are to be utilized. Members using the snack bar are responsible for disposing of all refuse. Trash baskets are provided at convenient locations.
- Children that are unable to swim safely to the pool sides, as determined by the lifeguards, shall not be permitted on the diving board without an adult/parent present. This includes children utilizing swim aids.
